Men's Soccer

#23 Judson 8, Robert Morris 1

Sept. 26, 2007 Claiming their seventh win of the season and staying perfect in the CCAC, #23 Judson University (7-3-1/3-0) garnered eight goals in their 8-1 win over Robert Morris (2-4-2/0-2). Both **Mark Howlett** and **Leonardo Silva** had two goals.

Just six minutes into the match, **Milos Bajic** scored the first goal of the game on an assist from **Adauto Oliveira**. Then, 10 minutes later, **Gustavo Oliveira** made it 2-0 from an assist from Bajic.

It was the second half that was explosive for the Eagles as they burnt the nets for six goals. After eight minutes of play, JU scored four goals in the next seven minutes. Silva started the net burning in the 53rd minute followed by two straight goals by Howlett in the 53rd and 56th minutes. In the 58th minute, RMC scored their lone goal to slow JU's pace. But, not for long as **Steve Moldenhauer** pushed the score to 6-1 in the 60th minute.

After four goals in seven minutes, Silva netted his second goal of the match in the 65th minute when Adauto Oliveira found him open. Adauto Oliveira finished the Eagles scoring in the 85th minute when he sailed in a free kick.

JU out shot RMC, 20-8. JU's goalies recorded six saves as **Neil Thompson** and **Kyle Selph** each had three a piece.

Men's Soccer

#23 Judson 9, St. Francis (IL) 1

Sept. 29, 2007 ... For the second game in a row, #23 Judson University burnt the nets on the field with a 9-1 win over the University of St. Francis. The men's soccer team is now 8-3-1 on the year and 4-0 in the CCAC.

Recording two goals a piece were **Gustavo Oliveira** and **Leonardo Silva**. Silva has now scored four goals in the last two games as he had two vs. Robert Morris.

Oliveira put Judson the board first in the 9th minute when he dribbled down the sideline and around

defenders for the score. Three minutes later, **Petar Bajic** made it 2-0 when he scored off USF's goalies save. **Tim Balatsoukas** netted a goal in the 18th minute when the Bajic brothers passed the ball around until they found Balatsoukas in the box. From 35-yardsout, **Vitor Bravo** put JU ahead by four, 4-0, with a beautiful shot that whizzed right into the back of the net. Silva then record the first of his two goals in the 34th minute off his chest from an Oliveira pass.

USF scored their lone goal in the second half (55th minute) to cut the lead to four, 5-1. JU then scored two goals in less than a minute in the 70th minute. Oliveira put his second goal of the game in when he tapped in the ball on a break away. Matching Oliveira, Silva scored the next goal in under a minute, alone, as he dribbled into the box for a 7-1 lead.

Senior **Mark Howlett** scored in the 75th minute on another JU break away as Oliveira found him

in the middle. Making his first collegiate goal in the 85th minute, sophomore **Sanon Eustache** shot in the ball from the middle of the box when Bajic found him open.

Overall, JU took 24 shots with 16 on goal. USF had 10 shots with seven on goal. Freshman Neil Thompson had five saves in the win.

Women's Soccer Robert Morris 4, Judson 1

Sept. 25, 2007 ... It was a hard night in Chicago for the Judson Eagles (3-4-1/1-3) as the women's soccer team fell to Robert Morris, 4-1, in CCAC play. JU's only goal came late in the second half.

Robert Morris (6-4/3-1) opened up with two goals in the first half. RMC took a 1-0 lead in the 17th minute and then made it 2-0 with a goal in the 36th minute. They then scored in the first three minutes of the 2nd half to extend their lead to three and followed that with a fourth goal in the 73rd minute.

Judson's **Christina Thornton** netted the Eagle's only goal in the 81st minute.

JU's **Rebecca O'Donnell** recorded five saves. JU did have more shots on goal, 11-7, but could not find the net.

Women's Soccer St. Ambrose 2, Judson 1

Sept. 27, 2007 ... After taking a 1-0 lead in the 2nd half, the Judson University (3-5-1) Eagles couldn't hold onto their lead as St. Ambrose University (4-5-1) came back to win, 2-1. This was the second game in three days for the women's soccer team.

After a scoreless first half, Judson added their only score in the 65th minute when **Samantha Vestal** soared in a shot from 30-yards out past the goalie. JU kept their lead for 15 minutes until SAU scored two goals in two minutes. The first goal came in the 80th minute followed by the second goal in the 82nd minute for the go-ahead score.

CCAC Players of the Week Thompson Named NAIA Region VII Goalie of the Week

Sept. 26, 2007 ... For the second time this season, two Judson University men's soccer players swept the CCAC (Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference) "Player of the Week." Both senior **Mark Howlett** and freshman **Neil Thompson** were given "Player of the Week" awards.

Howlett helped Judson with game winning goals in both matches. In the 1-0 overtime win over St. Xavier, he assisted Milos Bajic's winning goal on Wednesday. Then, on Saturday, he followed that up by scoring the first goal in a 2-0 victory over Trinity International University. The goal was Howlett's fourth of the season.

Garnering the CCAC Defensive "Player of the Week" for the second time this season is freshman Neil Thompson. He earned his second and third shutouts of the year with the pair of blankings over St. Xavier and Trinity International. He stopped six shots on goal vs. SXU before deflecting another four attempts against TIU. With his two shut outs, he also received the NAIA Region VII "Player of the Week" award, too. He now has three shut outs on the year.

Eagles only had four on goal as SAU had 11 on goal. **Rebecca O'Donnell** recorded nine saves in the loss.

Women's Soccer Judson 4, St. Francis (IL) 0

Sept. 29, 2007 ... Picking up their second shutout of the 2007 season, Judson University (4-5-1/2-3) dominated the University of St. Francis, 4-0. The win was the first shutout for goalie senior **Regan Sherwood**

Four different players scored for Judson all in the first half. The dominate first half featured 13 shots with eight on goal. Sophomore **Christina Thornton** started the scoring right off the back in the 3rd minute of the game when she received an aired out pass from **Sarah Schmitz** in the box for the score. Just 10 minutes later, freshman **Lynsey McFarland** netted a goal off a USF save in the box.

In the 21st minute, senior **Samantha Vestal** made it 3-0 when she took a pass from McFarland from the left side of the field. Sophomore **Kelly Ranallo** finished off the scoring just before the half in the 44th minute as Vestal found her open for a shot.

JU's defense only allowed four USF shots and only one shot in the second half. JU out shot USF, 18-4. JU also had 17 corner kicks and USF did not take any. In goal, senior Sherwood, in her first career start, had two saves and the shutout.

Volleyball Trinity Christian 3, Judson 1

Sept. 25, 2007 ... In CCAC play on the road, Judson University fell to Trinity Christian College, 3-1. The Eagles volleyball team now stands at 6-11 on the year and 2-2 in the CCAC.

Two players were in double figures for JU in kills in **Danielle Dull** and **Erin Bultinck**. Dull recorded 13 kills while Bultinck had 16 to lead the team. **Carly Campioni** had a career-high 44 assists and **Debra Leganski** dug 18 balls.

JU opened up the match with a tight 32-30 win in game one but then fell in the next three games 28-30, 27-30, and 23-30. JU had 19 kills in game two for a .255 hitting percentage.

Volleyball Judson 3, Grace 0

Sept. 29, 2007 ... In front of a homecoming crowd, Judson University (7-11) took three games from Grace College (6-8) for the win. JU won 30-20, 30-25, 30-24.

Three players had double figures in kills led by senior **Kym Gagnon** with 15. Senior **Erin Bultinck** and sophomore **Danielle Dull** added 13 each. **Carly Campioni** assisted 42 balls and **Debra Leganski** had 18 digs.

In game one, the score was tight early before JU made a run. With the score tied at eight, JU scored eight out of the next 10 points for a 16-10 advantage. Grace cut the lead to four, 16-12, but that is as close as they would come with the Eagles cruising to the 30-20 win.

Grace took an early 7-3 lead in game two only to see it dissipate. JU battled back to tie the game at 10 on a kill by **Michelle Weissman**. Grace scored the next five points for a 15-10 advantage only to see the lead fall again in a 6-0 run by JU. In the 6-0 run, Bultinck had two service aces. After a tie at 16, JU scored four of the next five points for a 20-17 lead. Grace fought back to within one, 22-21, but could not tie the game or retake the lead as the Eagles went on for a 30-25 win.

After a 4-4 tie, Grace took a 7-5 lead in game three. Again, they lost their lead but tied the game at 12. From that point, JU took over and scored six of the next seven points for a 18-13 lead. JU's lead was cut to two, 20-18, but three straight JU points put their lead back at five, 23-18. Grace never overcame the deficit as JU finished off the match, 30-23.
