Men's Soccer

#19 Judson 2, Olivet Nazarene 0

Oct. 10, 2007 With the rights of first place on the line in the CCAC (Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference), the Judson University men's soccer team (10-3-2/6-0-1) claimed a 2-0 win over Olivet Nazarene University. The win puts Judson a game and a half ahead of St. Xavier in the CCAC with ONU two games back.

After 38 minutes of battling, JU's Leonardo Silva gave the Eagles their first goal in the 39th minute when the ONU goalie mishandled the ball in goal. JU out shot ONU, 4-1, in the first half.

The second half brought more intensity by Olivet as the Tigers poured eight shots at Judson. JU's defense held up, though, and did not allow any goals. The Eagles were also a man down the final 30 minutes of the match due to a red card. Freshman Neil Thompson had three saves all in the second half to stop the Tigers. In the 77th minute, Gustavo Oliveira gave JU a security goal on a break away as the ONU goalie mishandled the shot again to make it 2-0.

ONU out shot JU, 9-8, and had four corner kicks to Judson's two. There were 36 fouls called in the match with 22 on Judson.

#19 Judson 3, Bethel College 1

Oct. 13, 2007 ... In a non-conference match in Indiana, the Judson University men's soccer team (11-3-2) continued their unbeaten streak of eight games with a 3-1 win over Bethel College (5-7-3). This was the second of four straight road games for the Eagles.

Vitor Bravo gave Judson a 1-0 lead quickly in the first half as he loafed in the first goal in the 7th minute. He put the ball in off an assist from Mark Howlett and Leonardo Silva.

In the second half, Gustavo Oliveira made it 2-0 in the 67th minute when Howlett and Milos Bajic found him open. In the 79th minute, Bethel cut the lead to one with their only goal. JU's Petar Bajic gave JU a

Coming into the match, JU sat behind ONU by one game as the Tigers were 5-2 in the CCAC. With the win, JU, ONU, and Robert Morris all have three losses while St. Xavier, Trinity Christian, and Trinity International all have one loss.

Freshman Lynsey McFarland (Livingston, Scotland) gave JU the momentum in the first half as she kicked a perfect goal from 20-yards out as it floated into the net on a direct kick in the 10th minute. JU's offense was on the attack as they took 10 shots to ONU's three in the first half but only netted one goal.

ONU tied the game at one at the 55th minute in the second half when Michelle Davis booted one in from the box. Both teams battled in the wind for the next 25 minutes until Judson received a free kick from 25 yards out on the side of the field. McFarland sailed the ball into the box and as a result junior Rebecca O'Donnell (Wheeling, Ill.) headed in the game winning goal in the 81st minute. Judson then kept pushing their offense in the final nine minutes to retain the lead.

JU out shot ONU, 17-11, and took five corner kicks to ONU's three. Sophomore Alice Phoneprasith had six saves in the win.

Women's Soccer Judson 10, Calumet 2

Oct. 11, 2007 ... Scoring nine goals in the first half, the Judson University women's soccer team (8-5-1/5-3) cruised to a 10-2 win over Calumet-St. Joseph (0-15/0-7). This is the fifth win in a row for the Eagles.

Freshman Janee Romesberg (Rockwood, Penn.) led JU with a hat trick of three goals in the first half. The three goals were her first of the year. She picked up goals three straight goals in the 23rd, 27th, and 31st minutes of the match. Sophomore Christina Thornton (Algonquin, Ill.) had two goals for JU in the 3rd and 8th minute of the match.

Lynsey McFarland (Livingston, Scotland) scored the first goal of the match in the 3rd minute (2:41) and then Thornton added her first just 17 seconds later for a 2-0 lead. Rebecca O'Donnell

Oliveira Named CCAC Offensive POW

October 15, 2007 ... Oliveira garnered the accord on the offensive side with his two goals and one assist in two wins, one of which was a conference affair. Tyton earned the defensive distinction by posting two shutouts in league play.

Oliveira provided security goals in the Eagles' 2-0 victory over Olivet Nazarene University on Wednesday and a 3-1 win over Bethel College (Ind.) on Saturday. He also registered an assist in the latter affair in playing a role in three of Judson's five goals during the seven-day span.

Last Week

Howlett Given 2nd POW Honor This Season

October 8, 2007 ... Judson University's Mark Howlett used a career-high four goals in one game to claim his second Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week award.

Howlett, a senior forward, accounted for Judson's first three goals en route to his career-high day in an eventual 6-0 league victory over Calumet College on Saturday. The four goals marked the second time this season that he has produced multiple tallies in a contest and gives him 11 on the campaign for a share of the conference lead. Howlett, who nabbed POW honors the first time

in Week 5, also started Judson's 1-1, double-overtime tie with Trinity Christian College on Tuesday, where he produced four shots, but no goals.

Phoneprasith Given CCAC Defensive POW Honor

October 8, 2007 ... Phoneprasith, making her first two appearances of the 2007 campaign, came up big in Judson's two victories, including a 4-3 conference overtime decision against NAIA No. 12-ranked Trinity

Christian College.

In that game, Phoneprasith came off the bench to start the second half in goal and limited Trinity Christian to just one goal over the final 46 minutes, while stopping six other shots. Included were key saves at the 77th and 88th minute of the contest to preserve the tie, which eventually set up Judson's game-winning goal just 30 seconds into overtime.

Phoneprasith followed that performance up by blanking Roberts Wesleyan College during her 76 minutes in goal on Saturday, where she had one save in teaming up for her first shutout of the season in the Eagles' 5-0 victory.

In all, Phoneprasith totaled seven saves on the week, while allowing just the one goal in 122 minutes of time in the net for Judson.

Women's Soccer - continued

(Wheeling, Ill.) scored in the 7th minute followed by Thornton's second goal in the 8th minute for a 4-0 advantage.

Emma Mugg (Shawnee, Kan.) made it 5-0 in the 19th minute which was followed by Romesberg's three straight goals over an eight minute period. Senior Regan Sherwood (Caledonia, New York) scored her first career goal in the 37th minute to make it 9-0.

Calumet, playing with only nine players, made a push in the second half with two goals on three shots. Jorie Arnold netted the first goal in the 54th minute and then Stephanie Butler scored the second goal in the 71st minute. In between the goals, JU's Andrea Pflaum (Bad Liebenzell, Germany) completed the Eagles' scoring with their 10th goal.

Krystle Arizmendi (Elgin, Ill.) recorded three assists while both Sarah Schmitz (Elgin, Ill.) and Amber Bocquin (Shawnee, Kan.) had two assists. Judson had 43 shots with 29 on goal and held Calumet to just three shots. Calumet took all three shots in the second half. Calumet combined for 19 saves, too.
