Men's Soccer

#19 Judson 1, Trinity Christian 1 2 OT

Oct. 2, 2007 Fighting to keep their perfect record in the CCAC, the Judson University men's soccer team tied Trinity Christian College (6-6-1/1-2-1), 1-1, in CCAC play. Judson is now 8-3-2 on the year and 4-0-1 in the CCAC.

TCC came right after Judson from the beginning and snagged a goal in the 16th minute when Ryan Clemens took a blocked kick into the box for the score and a 1-0 lead. JU could not net any of their goals in the first half as TCC's goalie had three saves on JU's six shots.

The second half brought more offensive opportunities for Judson as they shot five times with seven corner kicks. Junior **Leonardo Silva** finally broke the shutout in the 75th minute when he was on the receiving end of a breakaway from **Gustavo Oliveira** and **Steve Moldenhauer**. TCC had a chance to go ahead in the 2nd half in the 79th minute with an open shot to the net but the shot went left.

After regulation ended, both teams battled in over-times but neither team could get the ball into the back of the net. TCC had three shots in the first overtime and JU took one in the second.

JU took 12 shots with seven on goal while TCC too 10 shots with eight on goal. JU's goalie **Neil Thompson** finished with seven saves.

Men's Soccer

#19 Judson 6, Calumet 0

Oct. 6, 2007 ... Senior **Mark Howlett** scored the first three goals of the game and then added a his fourth in the second half as the #19 Judson University men's soccer (9-3-2/5-0-1) team shut out Calumet, 6-0. This is the second time this season that Howlett has scored two more goals in a match. The win for Judson gives them their ninth win of the year and a perfect 5-0-1 record in the CCAC.

Senior **Kyle Selph** started in goal on senior day posted his first shutout this season. He had four saves in four shots on goal. It is the fourth team shutout of the year.

Howlett put JU on the board in the 13th minute when he connected with **Milos Bajic** in the box. Just five minutes later he scored his second goal on a penalty kick after he was tackled in the box. In the 28th minute, Howlett nailed a shot from 15-yards out off an assist from senior **Andrew Weissman**.

In the second half, Weissman picked up his first goal of the year as he seared in a shot from 10 yards out off a Bajic corner kick. Howlett recorded his fourth goal in the 71st minute after he beat the goalie with his own pass and just tapped in the easy goal. Senior **Steven Moldenhauer** finished off the scoring with the sixth goal in the 76th minute on a break away along the sideline.

JU only allowed five Calumet shots but took 34 shots with 20 on goal. JU also had 10 corner kicks to Calumet's two.

Judson 4, #12 Trinity Christian 3 OT

Oct. 3, 2007 ... **Christina Thornton (Algonquin, Ill.)** thrilled the crowd less than a minute into overtime as she netted the winning goal as Judson (5-5-1/3-3) claimed a 4-3 win over #12 Trinity Christian (10-2-1/3-1-1). Thornton also had the tying goal in the 63rd minute.

The win puts Judson record back at .500 overall and in the CCAC. It is also a great win for the Eagles as TCC is #1 in the region and #12 in the nation.

Judson jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first half as **Baerbel Hartner (Ettrigen, Germany)** put the Eagles on the board first. After a rebound save by the TCC goalie in the box, Hartner was right there in the box to tap in the goal. **Lynsey McFarland (Livingston, Scotland)** made it 2-0 when she pushed the ball into the left side back net off an **Emma Mugg (Shawnee, Kan.)** corner kick.

The Trolls came roaring back as they tied the game with two goals in two minutes. TCC scored their first in the 35th minute and then tied the game at two in the 37th minute when Trisha Airth hit a free kick from 25 yards out.

With the intensity up in the second half, JU made a goalie change as **Alice Phoneprasith (Elgin, Ill.)** made her 2007 debut. In the half, she had six saves while facing seven shots on goal. The only goal that passed her came in the 59th minute when Nicole Billin bounced a shot in from 20-yards out. Just four minutes later, Thornton tied the game with her first goal of the game on a break away in the middle of the field. McFarland found Thornton open in the middle of the box and then Thornton tapped it in.

The excitement and enthusiasm brewing over from the 2nd half, JU scored quickly as Thornton made the game winning shot in the 91st minute when **Samantha Vestal (Bakersfield, Calif.)** found her in the box.

Overall, TCC out shot JU, 15-12, but each team took five corner kicks. **Rebecca O'Donnell (Wheeling, Ill.)** started the game and had two

CCAC Players of the Week

Silva Given 2nd CCAC Player of the Week Award

October 2, 2007 ... Claiming their third offensive award this year from the CCAC, the Judson University men's soccer team was given yet another CCAC "Player of the Week." Junior Leonardo Silva (Sao Paulo, Brazil) picked up the award for his 10 point performance in two matches.

For the second time this season, Silva earned the award as he was also the CCAC "Player of the Week" on September 4th. In two matches, Silva had four goals and two assists for 10 points. He helped JU to an 8-1 win over Robert Morris and then a 9-1 win against St. Francis.

In the match vs. RMC, he scored the fifth and seventh goals of the game and then assisted on another in the 8-1 win. Then, vs. USF, he added another two goals in the 9-1 win. It was the third time this season that he has had two goals in one match. Silva now has eight goals on the year which leads Judson. He is fourth in points with 21.

Women's Soccer Judson 5, Roberts Wesleyan 0

Oct. 6, 2007 ... On senior day at Dawson Field, the Judson University women's soccer team (6-5-1) gave their seniors a great show as they shut out Roberts Wesleyan (5-7), 5-0. It was the third shut out this season for Judson.

Leading the way for the Eagles was sophomore **Christina Thornton (Algonquin, Ill.)** as she had two goals in the first half. She netted the first goal in the 21st minute when **Samantha Vestal (Bakersfield, Calif.)** found her open on the sideline. Just seven minutes later, Vestal found Thornton again after Vestal's shot was deflected to Thornton in the box for Thornton to tap in the second goal of the game. Just before halftime, **Rebecca O'Donnell (Wheeling, Ill.)** notched her first goal of the 2007 season in the 42nd minute after she found **Emma Mugg's (Shawnee, Kan.)** free kick from outside the box.

Vestal scored her fourth goal of the year in the 54th minute when she floated a shot into the goal off a **Baerbel Hartner (Ettrigen, Germany)** assist. Freshman **Krystle Arizmendi (Elgin, Ill.)** sealed the 5-0 win in the 89th minute off an **Amber Bocquin (Shawnee, Kan.)** corner kick.

JU out shot RWC, 21-5, and had eight corner kicks to RWC's three. There were only 14 fouls, total, in the entire match, too.

Volleyball Judson 3, Davenport 0 Cornerstone 3, Judson 0

Oct. 5, 2007 ... On the first day of competition in Michigan, Judson split their matches. They picked up their first win over Davenport but then fell to host Cornerstone, 3-0.

In match one, Judson won 30-12, 30-27, 30-21 as they hit .225 overall as a team. They had nine total team blocks and 65 digs.

Senior **Erin Bultinck (Elgin, Ill.)** led the way with 11 kills while senior **Kym Gagnon (Flagstaff, Ariz.)** had 10 kills. **Carly Campioni (Crystal Lake, Ill.)** recorded 34 assists and **Debra Legan-**

ski (Elgin, Ill.) had 22 digs.

In match two, Judson fell to #20 Cornerstone, 30-22, 30-15, 30-16. Freshman **Jessie Fortner (Elgin, Ill.)** led the team with eight kills while **Campioni** had 33 assists.

Volleyball Judson 3, Aquinas 0 Judson 3, Grace 0

Oct. 6, 2007 ... Judson improved their overall record to 10-13 on day two with a sweep of their two matches. Both **Campioni** and **Gagnon** were named to the Cornerstone All-Tournament team, too.

Taking a 3-0 win over Aquinas (30-21, 30-16, 30-22), **Gagnon** powered down 16 kills with only two errors with a .483 hitting percentage. **Campioni** recorded 37 assists and **Leganski** had 18 digs. **Bultinck** had 12 digs. The team also recorded 12 team blocks with sophomore **Danielle Dull (Waupan, Wisc.)** blocking 5 balls.

In the second match of the day, Judson held off Grace College, 3-0 (30-27, 30-14, 32-30). **Bultinck** set a career-high of 19 kills with a .368 hitting percentage. **Campioni** also had a career match with 47 assists. **Gagnon** added 14 kills and **Leganski** recorded 28 digs. **Gagnon** also had 27 digs.
