Last Time Out

Judson University (8-14, 2-5) fell in their second CCAC game within the last week to Purdue Calumet (12-12, 5-3) on the road. The Eagles scored only 19 first half points and trailed by 23 going into the half. Rachel McBride and Daisy Jara led all Judson scorers with six points. McBride chipped in with a game high 10 rebounds while Jara added six rebounds.

CCAC Player of the Week

Freshman ShaRhonda Huff was named the CCAC Player of the Week on January 27th. She led Judson to two consecutive wins and was the leading scorer in both games. She set her career highs of points (19), steals (5), and assists (8) in an 89-33 win over Silver Lake on Saturday. Earlier in the week, she guided Judson to their second CCAC win, 68-55 over Trinity Christian, with 14 points and six rebounds. She averaged 16.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists, and 3.0 steals per game.

In CCAC/NAIA

Judson is 24th in the NAIA in three-point field goals made per game at 7.4 and Alicia Rovertoni is 24th in rebounding at 9.4.

Jim Cook is in his fifth season as the women's head coach at Judson University. In five years, he has guided Judson to one CCAC Tournament Championship and one NAIA National Tournament berth. He coached both the men's and women's teams at Judson, at the same time, from 2005 to 2008. His team won 21 games in his first season of 2005-06.

Calumet College Notes

Last Time Out

Calumet College came from behind to hold off Trinity Christian College for their fourth CCAC win of the year, 53-46. Calumet was down 15-12 with seven minutes to go in the first half before tying the game at 22 at the half. Calumet started off the second half on a 6-0 and had as large as an 11-point lead. Lisa Upshaw led the Crimson Wave with 16 points and six rebounds. Jackie Feldpausch had 10 points while Chabria Survillion added 11 points.

Last time vs. Judson

Both teams tied with a halftime score of 27, Judson reeled off the first seven points of the second half to claim their first CCAC win of the year over Calumet, 59-56. Kirstin Johns hit two free throws to seal the game and give Judson a five-point lead with 30 seconds left, 59-54. Lisa Upshaw had 26 points while Jackie Feldpausch had 15 points. Kirstin Johns led Judson with 15 points and Alicia Rovertoni had a double-double with 10 points and 16 rebounds.

Winning Streak

Calumet College is currently on a three-game winning streak which is second best in the CCAC behind Cardinal Stritch's 12 games. Calumet has defeated Moody Bible (69-41), Trinity International (75-73), and Trinity Christian (53-46). If they defeat Judson, it will be their longest winning streak under Schmidt. Calumet is also trying for their first program win over Judson.

Schmidt is in her third year at Calumet College and has turned the program around. After only winning seven games in her first two seasons, she has almost doubled those wins this year with 13.
